

The Division of Biostatistics and Epidemiology (DBE) has one to two tenured or tenure-track faculty positions at the associate or full professor level, in the area of biostatistics and epidemiology. Currently, DBE has more than 30 faculty members and was ranked 5th in NIH funding among similar groups nationwide.

The successful candidate will have: a doctoral degree in biostatistics,/statistics, epidemiology, or a related field; a strong record of independent research as well as collaboration on extramurally funded research; the intent and ability for scientific collaborative research and graduate level teaching; and excellent written and oral communication skills. Preference will be given to candidates with a proven peer-reviewed collaborative research publication record as well as a record of NIH-funded research. One of the appointed individuals may play a lead role in the CTSA Biostatistics and Epidemiology Core. The positions entail assisting the DBE in advancing its methodological and collaborative research mission by developing competitive extramural research and grant applications.
